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## **Intensive General English**

### **Course Topics**

### **Listening Skills**

A range of activities and listening types will be used to enable participants to develop confidence in their listening skills.

### **Speaking Skills**

Speaking skills are a core part of all lessons. A range of activities are used to develop confidence and fluency in speaking in a friendly, supportive classroom atmosphere.

### **Reading Skills**

A range of texts and tasks are used to enable students to read and extract relevant information effectively, and extend their vocabulary and grammar.

### Writing Skills

Students will develop and practise key aspects of writing skills in order to write a variety of text types appropriate to their level. Writing tasks may also be set for homework

#### Grammar Awareness

The necessary grammar for effective communication will be presented and practised in a variety of contexts appropriate to the level of the class.

### Vocabulary

Vocabulary development is a core part of all lessons and the course. A variety of activities and techniques will be used to build students' range of vocabulary and enable them to remember and use words and phrases correctly.

## **Course Content and Strategies**

The Intensive General English course is designed for participants looking for an intensive, in-depth study of English. The course develops all aspects of English - listening, speaking, reading and writing as well as grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation idioms and colloquial language. Classes are offered at 7 levels from Beginner to Advanced with up to 12 students in each class.

The class teacher is responsible for the class's progress and academic welfare, in liaison with the academic management team. Homework is set every day and there are student progress tests every 2 weeks, the results of which are monitored by the academic management team. Students have regular tutorials with their teachers to discuss their progress and ways to maximise their learning.
